The Southwell and Nottingham Multi-Academy Trust

Some of you may recall our sponsors writing to you last year about our plans to search for a suitable Multi-Academy Trust for The Samworth Church Academy to join. Since the announcement, the academy has been working in the background with the Department for Education to pursue joining The Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham's own Trust (SNMAT). One of the key reasons for us choosing to join the Southwell and Nottinghamshire MAT is that the ethos of their trust closely matches ours. We believe that by working with the other schools in the SNMAT the academy will be able to continue to grow and improve the quality of education we provide as well as make a distinctive contribution to school improvement both within the MAT and beyond.
